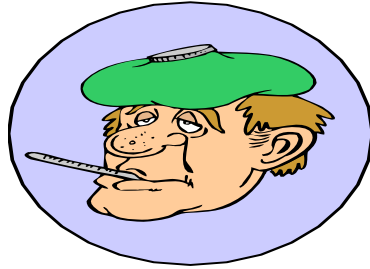

Safety Tip

Here are a few useful tips to keep you out of cross-traffic—and the hospital—at urban intersections:

Stopping for **Yellow** Lights:

Modern motorcycles have excellent brakes, but motorcyclists remain curiously invisible to many car drivers. If you decide to stop for a yellow light, pump your brakes to flash your brake lights. Keep an eye on your mirrors and your gear in case you need to take evasive action to avoid being rear-ended by a cage driver who's decided to run the light.

Entering Intersections Under **Yellow**:

If you decide to run a yellow light, make sure there isn't a car in the oncoming lane about to use the yellow interval as an opportunity to turn left across your path. If you cross the line very late on the yellow, be prepared that cross-traffic may already have a green light before you clear the intersection.

Going on **Green**:

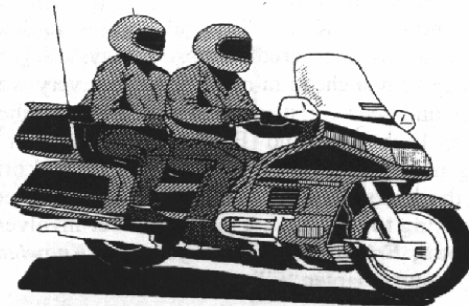
Never blast away from a green light without checking your left and right.

When you can, let cars traveling in your direction run interference for you as you cross the intersection, then accelerate into the open lane in front of you when there's no risk of being T-boned.

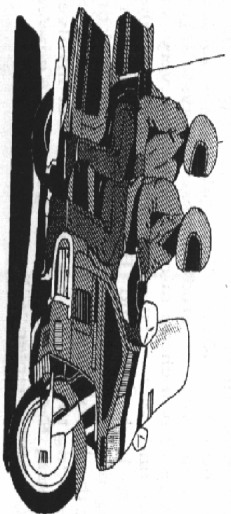
Timing your arrival at **Green** lights:

If you know your route well, it's often possible to time your passage so each light turns green just as you reach it. Never do this—especially on a motorcycle! You're asking to be a hood ornament on that last-second -of-yellow car.

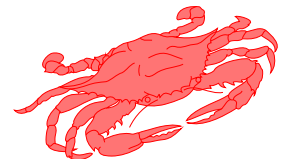

EMT-FA/CPR/AED Instructor

Congratulations if you are carrying a First Aid Kit on your Gold Wing. If you are not, please take this time to reconsider.

Will the "over the counter kit" do the job in a motorcycle accident with injuries.

I do not believe the store kits contain what is needed to properly handle fractures, dislocations, severe bleeding, or other major injuries to a fellow rider or co-rider. I am presenting this on the 25 years experience as an EMT and this is what I carry on my Gold Wing.

Any of the items may be purchased in drug stores, major retail stores (K-Mart/ Wal-Mart), or EMS supply.

- 1) First and most important in today's medical field of practice is a good set of medical gloves (2 to 3 pair). Always glove up before starting any medical treatment.
- 2) A CPR pocket mask is next, providing you protection while performing CPR.
- 3) Trauma shears to enable you to cut away clothing, giving you a good visual of the injury site.
- 4) Cold packs will help reduce swelling and discomfort of many injuries. Direct application of the cold pack IS NOT RECOMMENDED and should be wrapped in a washcloth or triangular bandage.
- 5) Trauma dressing may be needed for a major bleed. 4x4 dressings, when stacked together may help, but feminine pads work extremely well for trauma dressings and bleeding control due to their good absorption.
- 6) Kling is a good means of securing your pressure dressings or other gauze pads.
- 7) Triangular bandages (2 to 3).
- 8) Several rolls of medical tape, hypo allergenic, is recommended.
- 9) I also carry a bee sting stick and a tube of glucose for diabetic emergency (drug store over the counter products).
- 10) A small bottle of sterile water to cool a burn or flush an eye.
- 11) Throw in a bottle of antiseptic hand wash & washcloth for yourself after treatment.
- 12) Last but not least is the usual assortment of Band-Aids, 3x3 pads, 4x4 pads.

From the people that care!

- 13) The nylon bag I put this all in can be found at K-Mart in the fishing Dept. It is a 4-compartment nylon bag, one large compartment in the center top and three smaller compartments, one on each side and on the front.

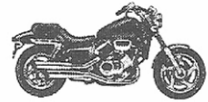

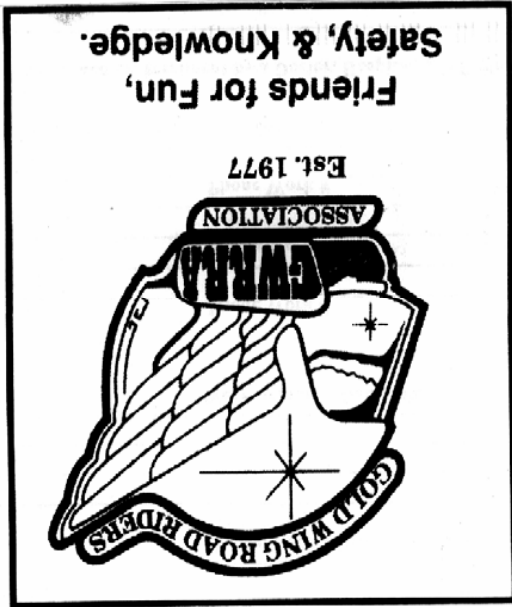
